CO 3. Differential calculus, basic rules rules of differentiations, economic application of differentiations.

CO 4.Single variable optimization and its application in profit maximization, cost minimization, revenue maximization.

CO 5.Integration of functions, basic rules of integration, economic application of integration in consumer's surplus, producer's surplus, problems relating to investment capital formation.

## Semester-II

Core course- 3

ECO-HC-2016 :Introductory Macroeconomics .

This course aims to introduce the students to the basic concepts of Macroeconomics. Macroeconomics deals with the aggregate economy. This course discusses the preliminary concepts associated with the determination and measurement of aggregate macroeconomic variable like savings, investment, GDP, price indices national income accounting inflation and the balance of payments.

On completion of the course students will understand

CO 1.Introduction to Macroeconomics and National Income Accounting.

CO2. Various concept and function of money, quantity theory of money, demand and supply of money.

CO 3.Concept on Inflation.

CO 4.The closed Economy in Short run. Classical and Keynesian model of income determination. IS-LM model.

Core course-4

ECO-HC-2026:Mathematical Methods for Economics-II

This course is the second part of a compulsory two-course sequence. This part is to be taught in Semester II following the first part in Semester I. The objective of this sequence is to transmit the body of basic mathematics that enables the study of economic theory at the undergraduate level, specifically the courses on microeconomic theory, macroeconomic theory, statistics and econometrics set out in this Syllabus. In this course, particular economic models are not the ends, but the means for illustrating the method of applying mathematical techniques to economic theory in general. The level of sophistication at which the material is to be taught is indicated by the contents of the prescribed textbook.

On completion of the course students are expected to understand:

CO 1.Linear algebra; matrix and determinant, matrix operation and applications.

CO2.Functions of several variables; homogeneous and differential functions.

CO 3.Multi-variable optimization

CO 4.Differential Equation and application to market model.



CO 5. Difference Equation Cob-web market model.

### **Semester III**

Core course 5

**ECO-HC-3016 :Intermediate Microeconomics-I**

The course is designed to provide a sound training in microeconomic theory to formally analyze the behaviour of individual agents. Since students are already familiar with the quantitative techniques in the previous semesters, mathematical tools are used to facilitate understanding of the basic concepts. This course looks at the behaviour of the consumer and the producer and also covers the behaviour of a competitive firm.

On completion of the course students are expected to understand:

CO 1. Consumer theory; utility, budget constraint, revealed preference.

CO2. Production cost and perfect competition.; production with one and more more variable inputs, returns to scale, short and long run cost curves in perfect competition.

### **Core course 6**

**ECO-HC-3026 : Intermediate Macroeconomics-I**

This is a course on statistical methods for economics. It begins with some basic concepts and terminology that are fundamental to statistical analysis and inference. It then develops the notion of probability, followed by probability distributions of discrete and continuous random variables and of joint distributions. This is followed by a discussion on sampling techniques used to collect survey data. The course introduces the notion of sampling distributions that act as a bridge between probability theory and statistical inference. The semester concludes with some topics in statistical inference that include point and interval estimation.

On completion of the course students are expected to understand:

CO 1. Aggregate Demand and Aggregate Supply; derivation of aggregate demand and aggregate supply curves.

CO2. Inflation, unemployment and expectations.

CO 3. Open Economy Model; short run open economy model purchasing power parity, balance of payments, international financial markets.

This is a course on statistical methods for economics. It develops the notion of probability and probability distributions of discrete and continuous random variables.

covers statistical concepts of hypothesis testing, estimation and diagnostic testing of simple and multiple regression models. The course also covers the consequences of and tests for misspecification of regression models.
