Location of the College:

The college is situated in the southern bank of the River Brahmaputra in the revenue village Purangaon in the district of Kamrup beside Boko -Sontali P.W. D. road. The college which is 30 kms distance from 37 National Highway and approximately 70 kms far from Gauhati University. The college stands in a vast minority areas along with scenic natural beauty around the college.

programmes offered by the College :

Sontali Anchalik College offers the following programmes in Arts stream Under GU-FYUGP, of three years duration in 06 (six) Semesters under the Academic control of Gauhati University from the academic session 2023-2024.

1. Degree with Major and Minor :

In this case , a student studies one major subject which consists of 15 courses and two Minor s which consists of 6 courses (3 for each Minor) . The student can also utilise the free credits to study another Minor as well (3 more core courses in another subject) .

2. Degree without Major :

In this case, a student studies all the three courses equally over a period of 3- year programme.

3. Degree with Double Major :

In this case, a student needs to utilise all the free credits (12 in total) to study three more courses at one of the Minors and another 24 credits from MOOCs (subject to Permission) on the same Minor to earn Total credits of 48. In this case the students get a second Major in that subject (From the Minor Subjects)

It should however be noted that a second Major (or Double Major) can be obtained only if the student earns the First Major.

Curricular Components :

The entire FYUGP curriculum is divided into two parts

- a. Core Courses
- b. Common Courses.

Core Courses :

The core courses constitute Major and Minors. Usually, a student will choose one Major Subject and two Minor subjects. Different options are described in the next section. All core courses have a credit allocation of 4. All together, irrespective of any Major or Minor options, a student will necessarily need to take 21 courses with total credit allocation of 84 over a three year programme.

Major course :

The minimum credits requirements for a Major course over a three years period is 60 which translates to 15 courses.

Minor course :

The minimum credits requirements for a Minor course over a three years period is 12 which translates to 3 courses.

Second Major Course :

Provided a student has a Major course with 60 credits, she / he can convert one of the Minor courses to a second Major only with a credit allocation of 84, in that case he / she get a Degree with Double Major and Minor.

Common Courses :

All the Students of FYUGP will have to take the common course of 36-credit allocation which is divided over five subdivisions. They are-

- A) Multidisciplinary courses (Multi) 3-Credit each during semesters 1-3, Total 9-Credits.
- B) Value Added courses (VAC) 2-Credit each during semesters 1,2 & 4 total 6-credits.
- C) Ability enhancement Courses (AEC) 2-Credit each during semesters 1,2 & 5, 6 total 8-credits.
- D) Skill enhancement courses (SEC) 3- Credit each during semesters 1-3, total 9-Credits.
- E) Internship - Total credits – 4

A brief description of these courses are given bellow

Multidisciplinary courses :

These are three credit courses spanning over six different groups of Subjects. The Multidisciplinary subjects are class XII level courses . In GU-FYUGP, all these categories will have three papers, each student need to take any three papers during semesters 1-3 .





All students need to take three Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) from a pool of courses during Semesters 1, 2 & 3.

Internship :

All student are to carry out an internship with a credit allocation of 4. The Internship can be carried out any semester during semesters 3-6. As internships meant to be done during semester breaks, they will not interfere with other classes.

Free Credits :

From third to sixth semesters, one will have time for 4 free credits per semester, which one can unutilised for having more Minors. They can also come handy, one had changed a Minor subject in between.

Students Attendance :

Students must have at least 75% attendance in all courses held in one academic session, failing which the college shall have the right to take necessary action as per Gauhati University Guidelines.

EXAMINATIONS & EVALUATION

Examinations:

Examinations, whether internal or external, theory or practical, would be counted separately for the purpose of considering a student passed or failed. If a student does not appear in a paper (internal or external, theory or practical) in an examination, the student will be considered failed in that paper.

Evaluation:

A student's performance will be evaluated throughout the year based on continuous assessment. Evaluation of the student's performance in each semester for every course/paper will be based on the following:

- Internal Assessment (IA)
- End Semester Examination (ESE) For a student to pass in a course/paper, she/he has to pass in both Internal Assessment and End Semester Examination separately.

Internal Assessment (IA):

IA will ideally account for 20% of the total marks allotted to a course/paper. For evaluating the performance of the students in a continuous way, the following measures will be adopted for distributing marks earmarked for IA.

Sessional (mid-term) Examination :

Sessional examination will be conducted for 50% of the total marks allotted for IA of a course/paper. (For example, if 20 marks is allotted for IA of a course/paper, then 10 marks will be kept aside for assessment in sessional or mid-term examination. The sessional examination will be held for 30 marks for the convenience of setting questions and covering the syllabus and the marks secured by the students will be proportionately converted to be out of 10 marks. Duration of the examination will be one hour. The question papers of the sessional or mid-term examinations will be set by the concerned teacher(s) and the evaluated answer scripts will be shown to the students and corrections will be made, if any without hampering regular classes as far as practicable.

20% of the marks allotted for IA will be awarded to the students based on class attendance. If the total marks for IA is 20, then 4 marks will be awarded to the students based on class attendance. The following criteria will be adopted for awarding marks under this category:

- a. Class attendance from 76% to 80%..... 1 mark;
- b. Class attendance from 81% to 85%..... 2 marks;
- c. Class attendance from 86% to 90%..... 3 marks;

- d. Class attendance from 91% and above..... 4 marks.

The rest 30% of the marks allotted for IA will be distributed and awarded on the basis of performance of the students on the following criteria:

- a. Home assignments;
- b. Seminar/Group discussions;
- c. Field work;
- d. Performance in co-curricular and extra-curricular activities

Procedure for conducting Sessional examination:

- a. The sessional examination as part of Internal Evaluation will comprise of 50% of the marks earmarked. Since Internal Evaluation component will be of 20 marks, Sessional examination will be held for determining students' performance out of 10 marks. For the convenience of setting questions and covering the syllabus, the Sessional examination will be held for 30 marks of one hour duration and the marks secured by the students will be proportionately converted to be out of 10 marks. The sessional examination for a paper will be conducted by the teacher(s) who teaches that paper.
- b. The teacher(s) concerned will fix the date of the sessional examination in each paper. The students shall write their answers in the sessional examinations in proper 'additional answer scripts' of Gauhati University.

N.B. : Procedure of Evaluation and Sessional examination for FYUGP will be disclosed later as per the instruction of Gauhati University.

Seat Reservation :

Seats are reserved for SC/ST/OBC/MOBC as per Government rules.

College Uniform :

For boys – Aqua green shirt and black formal pants

For Girls – Aqua green Kurta and white trousers with white Dupatta.

Identity Card :

For each students the College authority will issue non-transferable identity card.

Use of Mobile Phone :

The use of Mobile Phone within the college campus is strictly prohibited.

Students Union :

Sontali Anchalik College Student's Union is constituted annually as per guidelines of Gauhati University.

SUPPORT SERVICES

Central Library, Sontali Anchalik College : (Renamed latter)

The College has a Library with sufficient collection of precious various books and Journals including text books of different subjects as required for usual Academic Programme. In addition to a good number of reference books, periodicals a number of News papers both in English and Assamese daily are available in the Library. The students and teachers of the college are entitled to avail library facilities for their Academic and personal development.

LIBRARY RULES

- a. Students are issued Library Cards and a students can borrow a book for ten days from the date of issue.
- b. The Library remains open from 9.00 AM to 5.00 PM.
- c. A student is be paid Rs 200 / as caution money.
- d. Penalty will be imposed for violating the Library Rules.

SCHOLARSHIP :

The students of the college get Minority scholarships on the basis of the Merit as per scheme of the Govt. of Assam.

STUDENTS AID FUND :

The college has a student “AID FUND“ for the poor and meritorious students of the college . A student who wants to take help of this fund, shall have to apply to the principal with supporting documents.

HOSTEL FACILITIES :

Hostel facilities are available only for the Girls students .

COMMON ROOM FACILITIES:

The college has separate Common room’s facilities both for Boys and Girls , with sufficient indoor game facilities .

CANTEEN FACILITIES : (Under construction)

The canteen in the college campus will provide fresh items to the students within short time.

STUDENTS UNION :

The college has a general body of the students known as the Sontali Anchalik College Student Union. All the students are the members of this Union. The portfolios of this Union are annually elected.

NOTICE BOARD :

The College notice board is stand in the middle corridor of the college. The students must follow the instructions issued by the authority time to time, which will be reflected in the Notice Board.

INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)

In Pursuance of the National Action Plan of the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) for the performance of Evaluation , assessment and accreditation and quality enhancement of education in regards to Higher Education , the NAAC proposes that every institution should have to established an “Internal Quality Assurance Cell “ .Since Quality enhancement is a continuous process , the IQAC is a part of an institution system and task of the IQAC is to develop a system for conscious, consistent and catalytic improvement in the performance of institution. The IQAC makes a significant and meaningful role in the post accreditation period. The IQAC will visualize the efforts and measures of the college towards academic excellence under the effective guidance of the IQAC. The following sub-committee cells are formed for the smooth functioning of the institutional quality mechanism.

1 . CRITERIA WISE SUB-COMMITTEE :

- 1.3 Research Consultancy extension sub-committee : This sub-committee deals with the activities of the institution in regards to research .
- 1.4 Infrastructure and Learning Resource Sub-committee : This sub- committee deals with the adequacy and optional use of the facilities available in the institution .
- 1.5 Student Support and progression sub-committee : This sub – committee deals with the effort of the institution to provide assistance for meritorious students and to facilitate the progression , alumni profiles .
- 1.6 Governance and Leadership sub-committee : This sub – committee deals with the policies and practices at the college in the matters of planning human power requirement training , performance , appraisal and financial management .
- 1.7 Innovation and Best Practices Sub-committee : This sub-committee deals with the innovation and unique practices of the institution that adds to its academic ambience.

2 . INTERNAL COPLAINT COMMITTEE (ICC)

The Internal Complaint Committee (ICC) of Sontali Anchalik College was constituted in accordance with the sexual harassment at work place (prevention, prohibition and redressal) Act. 2013. The college is a co-educational institution providing equal opportunities to all. However if there are any complaints involving physical contacts or advances, demands for sexual favors, sexually tainted remarks and any unwelcome physical, verbal expression of sexual nature, it is addressed and appropriate action is taken. The ICC has tried to create

awareness on the issue of sexual harassment by conducting workshops and lectures by lawyers and administrative officers.

3 .GRIEVANCE AND REDRESS CELL

Grievance and Redressal Cell of Sontali Anchalik College deals with various grievances of the students as well as the staff.

4. Alumni Association : The members of Alumni Association are actively associated with the overall development of the College.

5. Committee on Sexual harassment against Women : As per UGC guideline a committee on sexual harassment against women has constituted to look into the matter of sexual harassment against women student and employers of the college.

6.Carrier Guidance & Counseling Centre: This Centre provides regular information, guidance, and important training and conducts seminars etc. to develop the professional carrier of the students.

7. Health Care Unit : This Unit takes initiative to provide all sorts of health and medical assistance for the students and staff during the working hour of the college and arranges blood donation camp, free health camp and various awareness programs in regards to health etc. for the community.

8.Gender Equity and Women Empowerment Cell: The Gender Equity and Women Empowerment Cell has established to concentrate its activities towards community mobilization and development of Women.

9. The National Service Scheme : The NSS Unit of the College provides opportunities for Students to render social service both inside and outside of the college campus.

10. Examination Board : The Examination Board conducts and control all the internal examinations of the College.

11. Electoral Literacy Club (ELC):

An Electoral Literacy Club is a platform to engage the students through interesting activities and hands on experience to sensitize them on their electoral rights and familiarize them with the electoral process and voting.
